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Andrea Stolowitz is an internationally produced playwright, librettist, and educator. Her work embraces bold theatricality ranging from intimate portrayals of the human condition to the intersection of national history on private lives. Andrea's work in traditional and experimental theater and opera often uses interviews and personal testimonies as the basis for her work. In 2025, Andrea was named the recipient of the \$25,000 Miller Foundation Sparks Fellowship award for mid-career artists.
